School-based Traineeship Pathway

School-based Traineeships

Students who can demonstrate that they are seriously considering a career and/or further study in the disability/healthcare sector will be strong contenders for a position in Minda's School-based Traineeship program.

Applicants must:

- Be enrolled in school and in Year 12 in 2022
- Submit a cover-letter and resume
- Attend an employment interview
- Be available to commence work placement in January 2022

If traineeship enrolment is successful, applicants will sign a work contract with the employer and also sign-up with an Apprenticeship Network Provider.

**Be advised that traineeships are subject to a 60-day probationary period.*

Course commencing

Course Duration

- 12 months (*nominal completion*)
- 1 day/week during school terms
- 14 classroom workshop sessions
- 9:00am—3:00pm (classroom)
- 34 work days (7.5 hours) minimum.

- Have a level of physical fitness to work in the Allied Health industry
- Show a genuine interest in developing skills and knowledge related to the allied health & disability sectors
- Access to a computer, email and internet
